Remembering Vivian Bales

In 1929, Vivian Bales embarked on a 78-day cross-country journey on her new Harley. She covered a staggering 5,000 miles at a time when long distance travel was challenging and daring.

As she crossed the vast and diverse American landscape she believed her Harley was the "key to the whole United States". Her trip symbolized the growing fascination with motorcycles as a means of self expression and she became a symbol of empowerment for women at the time.

Her journey was well-documented by the press and she was widely celebrated – adding to the allure of the emerging role of women in activities traditionally dominated by men.

Her incredible ride remains a milestone and a great example of the spirit of adventure and determination.
