

What to do (and NOT do) at a crash scene

Rule Number One is always maintain your own safety. Then call for help.

Until EMS arrives:

- Once you are safely off the road, activate your flashers and aim a headlamp at the victim if at night.
- Should you absolutely need to move someone, your goal is to try to keep the person's spine aligned. Their gear and helmet will help you to slide them.
- 'Stop The Bleed' with direct pressure or tourniquet.
- Keep the person warm. Hypothermia makes it hard for blood to clot. Consider positioning a running bike near the victim to provide heat & shelter from wind.

What NOT to do:

- *Do not* remove the helmet (If absolutely necessary to stop bleeding, check for emergency release tabs that free cheek pads making removal easier on some models.)
- *Do not* have person sit up or walk
- *Do not* remove an impaled object
- *Do not* give the person anything to drink
- *Do not* give any pain meds you happen to carry

Try to get a jump on info the EMS will need –

If the person cannot talk to you:

(You are covered under the Good Samaritan law)

- Feel for pulse at neck, and watch for chest to rise
- Look for ID
- Look for a phone that has an ICE (In Case of Emergency) feature

If the person can talk to you:

(There is no guarantee they will still be able to do so when EMS arrives)

- Obtain name, address, contact info
- Determine if any meds are being taken
- Determine if any allergies to meds or latex
- Find out when they last ate or drank anything
- Ask if anyone else was on the bike (Someone might be unseen in a ditch!)
- And, finally, you can assist by providing human contact and reassurance that help is on the way

From the statistics, registered bike numbers rise & fall, but, even if every rider owns several bikes, it looks like fewer & fewer bikers are taking free training classes offered by the state.
